GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE SCHOOL

The Navy Children School [NCS (Mumbai)] is a co-educational school for classes from Std. I to XII and is located in Navy Nagar, Colaba. This school was commissioned on 14 November 1989 by Mrs. Krishna Jain, President, Navy Wives Welfare Association and follows the CBSE curriculum. It is run by the Navy Education Society (NES) and administered by the Headquarters, Western Naval Command. It prepares pupils for examinations conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

The motto of NES is: सर्वोत्तम सर्वत्र सर्वदा।

- Aim:** The Navy Children School aims at the over-all development of each student's personality, laying emphasis on the inculcation of a rational outlook. The school endeavours to achieve academic excellence amongst the students and the development of an insatiable thirst for knowledge. It also aims at promoting basic human values of life.
- Academic Session:** The academic session of the school commences on the first working day of April and ends on the last working day of March.
- Syllabus & Curriculum:** The medium of instruction is English. For Std. IX and X, a second language option (between Hindi and Sanskrit) is given. Sanskrit is taught as a third language from Std. VI to VIII. Prescribed books – NCERT
Extra classes for X & XII will be conducted throughout the year for intense preparation for their Board Exam. School will make all effort to arrange for buses but if it is not possible then parents are requested to make their own arrangement.
- Streams of Study:** NCS, Mumbai offers three streams of Study in std. XI & XII - Science, Commerce and Humanities

- b. A student can apply for a maximum of two posts only allocated for respective class i.e., a student cannot apply for more than two posts for a particular category in which he or she belongs to.
- c. Any student debadged in the previous academic year, will not be eligible for any post.
- d. Students involved in serious disciplinary issues are not allowed to contest for any post.
- e. Annual Examinations only will be considered for all posts.

ADMISSION SCHEDULE FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2025-26 IN NCS (MUMBAI)

Category of Admission

All admissions shall be as per the categories mentioned below and would be subject to the availability of seats in the concerned class. For the purpose of admission to Naval schools, the children will be placed in the following categories in descending order of priority, as amended by NES from time to time: -

- (a) **Category 1.** Naval personnel: -
 - (i) Serving personnel (incl Defence Security Corps) posted in station/ city.
 - (ii) Family staying in Separated family/ Selected Place of Residence (SPR) accommodation in station/ city, serving personnel on deputation with other organisations (eg NSG, DRDO etc.) posted in station/ city, superannuated service personnel who exercised choice of home station in last one year of service.
 - (iii) Widows.
- (b) **Category 1A.** Personnel from IA and IAF: -
 - (i) Serving personnel on deputation with IN and posted in station/ city.
 - (ii) Personnel serving in Tri Service organisation in station/ city.
 - (iii) Widows.
- (c) **Category 1B.** Personnel from IA and IAF: -
 - (i) Serving personnel of IA and IAF not on deputation with IN or posted in Tri- Service organization but posted in station / city.
 - (ii) Serving personnel of Indian Coast Guard (ICG).
- (d) **Category 1C.**
 - (i) ESM of IN residing in the city/ station: -
 - (aa) Who retired with pension
 - (ab) Who invalided out on medical grounds with pension.
 - (ii) Serving personnel from IA& IAF who have chosen the city/ Station as SPR.
 - (iii) Wards of school staff, running the school.
- (e) **Category 2.** ESM of IN not residing in the city/ station: -
 - (i) Who retired with pension.
 - (ii) Who invalided out on medical grounds with pension.
- (f) **Category 2A.** ESM of IA and IAF: -
 - (i) Who retired with pension.
 - (ii) Who invalided out on medical grounds with pension.
- (g) **Category 2B.** Defence civilians working with IN in the same station/ city.
- (h) **Category 3.** ESM of IN: -
 - (I) Who retired without pension
 - (ii) Who invalided out on medical grounds without pension.

- (j) **Category 3A.** ESM of IA and IAF: -
- (i) Who retired without pension.
- (ii) Who invalidated out on medical grounds without pension
- (k) **Category 3B.** Personnel of all three Services who are not categorised as ESM.
- (l) **Category 3C.** Defence civilians working with IA and IAF posted in same station/ city.
- (m) **Category 4A.** Grand children of service personnel
- (n) **Category 4B.** All others.

Note:- For Category 1A to 4B: In case of limited vacancies or tie, a student with higher age may be given priority for admission.

Registration. Registration of students for admission will be done at the beginning of the academic session for classes for which vacancies exist. The respective schools will promulgate firm dates and online applications through school website. Mere registration for admission in the school does not guarantee any admission.

Online Provisional Admission of Category-I Children. All Naval schools are to ensure online provisional admission for Category – 1 students.

Admission of Children coming from Abroad. A ward of serving IN personnel, who went abroad with his/ her parent on their deputation to a foreign country, will be admitted to corresponding class on their return to India in the naval school where admission is being sought (such admission will be over and above the class strength). An undertaking from the parents is to be taken stating that the child studied in a recognised school abroad for admission in class IX and above.

Admission against Vacant Seats. In case, seats remain vacant after 30th June, as the case may be, in the year of admission, the Vice Chairperson SMC is empowered to allow admissions up to the prescribed strength as per the priorities in admission up to 31st July.

Admission Age Criteria. The admission age criteria as per NEP 2020 is to be implemented progressively, as mentioned below:-

Other conditions for Admission

(a) A child must be of minimum age as indicated in the table as on 31st March in the academic year in which admission is sought for the respective Class (the child born on 1st April should also be considered). An upper age limit for admission in a class is fixed as the minimum age limit plus two years. No child would be eligible for admission in a class if his/ her age is more than this maximum age prescribed. The maximum age would be relaxed by two years for differently abled children. Admission shall be granted as per categories mentioned.

(b) No admission test will be conducted for admission to Class I/ Balvatika I. All the applications received for admission would be arranged as per the Categories. Each category would then be taken up for admission in the order of priority i.e. Category-1 first, Category- 1A next, and so on until all the vacancies are filled.

(c) The number of children from categories other than Categories I, II, and III shall not exceed 30% of the total strength of the school.

(d) A maximum of two children of each Regular employee (post confirmation) of the school may be given admission in the school under concerned category mentioned at Article 0402.

(e) Maximum class strength be limited as per CBSE guidelines.

(f) Students wishing to continue studies at 10+2 level on completion of Class X, will have to seek re-admission as per the CBSE norms. Provisional admission to Class XI shall be given to all in-house students of Class X and then students of other NAVAL SCHOOLS coming with TCs. However, a student seeking fresh admission in Class XI from other schools shall be considered based on merit, availability of seats and the above mentioned categories (Category 1-4B).

(g) A student coming from another recognised school shall not be admitted to a class higher than the one in which he was studying in the former school unless the transfer certificate states that he/she has been promoted to the next higher class before 30 June.

(h) Direct admission, i.e. admission without a TC shall be made only up to Class VI. If a student, who has not previously attended any recognized school, applies for admission to any of the classes from Class-II to Class-VI, his parent / guardian shall be required to give a full history of his / her previous education and submit an affidavit to the effect that his ward has not attended any recognized school till then. He shall also be required to produce a certificate of proof of age as required for Class I. If a seat is available in the class to which admission is sought, the Principal shall arrange a special test to determine the suitability of the student for admission to that class. Admission shall be granted if the pupil passes the special test. If the parent / guardian's statement under this clause is found to contain any willful misinterpretation of date of birth or other facts regarding the student's educational record, the Principal shall take necessary action as per the latest CBSE/ KVS guidelines on the subject and report the matter to the Management.

(i) To streamline the admission process, all relevant/ required documents applicable to the particular Class of admission as mandated by CBSE from time to time are to be collected from the parent/ guardian.

GUIDELINES ON ONLINE ADMISSION TO CATEGORY - I **STUDENTS IN NCSs**

Online Registration:-

1. Online registration portal for admission to NCSs has been made available in respective school website.

2. Procedure for online registration of Category-I students is as below:

(a) Inter NCS Transfer - Parent is to register online by providing personal particulars, category of admission, admission number at previous NCS; upload a copy of serving certificate issued by unit or latest transfer letter or salary statement, Transfer Certificate (TC), if available; and indicate the date from which admission is sought.

(b) Transfer from non-naval school to NCS - Parent is to register online by providing personal particulars, category of admission and upload a copy of serving certificate issued by unit or latest transfer letter or salary statement and Indicate the date from which admission is sought. In addition, recent report card/ mark sheet and TC (If available) from the current school where the child is studying are also to be uploaded.

3. On submission of the application, an acknowledgement of receipt of the application will be shared with the applicant.

Provisional Admission

4. Provisional admission shall be applicable only for Category-I students (Children of serving IN personnel). No screening procedure be followed for admission of Category-1 students.

Confirmation of Admission

5. Admission would be confirmed on submission of original TC and payment of fee. In case neither of the parents are available in the station, legal guardian of the child be authorised by the parent(s) through a notarised affidavit to submit the original copy of the TC.

The acceptable proof of age will be the certificate of Birth issued by a competent authority e.g. Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai, Notified Area Committee of the place of birth of child for standard I or Transfer certificate from previous school for all subsequent classes.

WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

Cases of Withdrawal

Withdrawal by Parents. Parent desirous of withdrawing the child from the school is to apply on the prescribed form for issue of Transfer Certificate.

Withdrawal on Poor Academic Performance (from Classes IX to XII). One failure in a Class for an academic session may be condoned by permitting the student to repeat the class in which he / she fails. If a student fails for the second time, he / she will be ordered to be withdrawn from the school.

Withdrawal on Disciplinary Grounds. In the interest of the school, the Principal, with the prior approval of the Chairperson, SMC, may withdraw a student from school, should the student's conduct, behaviour or influence, in the opinion of the Principal, be detrimental to good order and general discipline.

Withdrawal on Medical Grounds. The school shall arrange for medical examination of students annually. If a student is suffering from any disease and in the opinion of the Medical Authority the attendance of the student in the school is a health hazard to the other students, he / she will be asked to withdraw from the school until the disease is fully cured.

Withdrawal due to Non-Payment of Fees. Non-payment of fees for two months after due date for payment shall be notified to parents. In case of non- payment of fees thereafter, concerned student may be withdrawn from the school. Re-admission may be made subject to clearance of all dues and availability of seat in the class.

ISSUE OF TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

- i) Online Transfer Certificate application feature is provided in Scientific StudyApp. To raise request, parent can apply for transfer certificate.
- ii) Request for Online Transfer certificate is to be given 15 days in advance and Transfer Certificate will be issued only on clearance of all dues.
- iii) Duplicate copy of a Transfer Certificate is not normally issued. Duplicate copy may be issued on production of an affidavit that the original Transfer Certificate has been lost and penalty of Rs 100/- will be charged.
- iv) In case Transfer Certificate has been applied for, there will be no cancellation.
- v) If Transfer Certificate is 11th or any date after 10th, fee for the whole month will be retained by the school.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PARENTS

1. Please read and understand the contents of this almanac. Check it regularly for entries from the school.
2. Parents should furnish to the school, their latest office and residential address and telephone numbers. These are vital in the interest of the safety of the students.
3. See that your child carries textbooks/exercise books according to the timetable for the day. Parents must glance through the books, notebooks and answer papers of their children.
4. Parents should not call up teachers at their residence. The problems/doubts should be emailed to prin.ncs.mb@gmail.com seeking an appointment with the concerned teacher.
5. Encourage your wards to take a balanced interest in studies, cocurricular activities and sports. Ensure that they are prepared for Continuous Assessment.
6. Children are prohibited from bringing crackers, colours etc. to the school. Bursting of crackers or playing with colours is liable to lead to suspension/expulsion of a student from school.
7. Wards should be instructed to be careful about their belongings. Expensive articles like jewellery and excess cash should not be brought to school. In case of violation of this rule the articles will be confiscated.
8. Boys must have a proper haircut. Girls must plait their hair if it is longer than their shoulders.
9. The school discourages distribution of chocolate bars and expensive confectionary on the birthday of the students. Simple wrapped sweets are acceptable.
10. Students should not visit public places in school uniform. They are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both in school and outside. Misbehaviour in public places will be dealt with severely.
11. Delivery of tiffin, books etc. to the school during working hours, will not be accepted.

12. Parents will not be permitted to take students home during working hours for any reason, unless there is a medical emergency which has been communicated by the school.
13. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE PARENTS ALLOWED TO DIRECTLY WALK INTO THE CLASS ROOMS. THEY NEED TO HAVE PRIOR APPOINTMENT TO MEET THE TEACHERS IN THE VISITORS' LOUNGE.
14. If you wish to meet the Principal, Vice Principal, Head Mistress or teachers, do visit at the time indicated on the inside of the front cover page.
15. The main gate will be closed after visiting hours of the Principal, Vice Principal and teachers. Please co-operate with the school for the safety & security of our students.
16. Appointment with doctors or any social engagements must not be arranged during school hours. No partial attendance will be permitted. In case of medical appointment/visit to the Hospital in the morning the student will be permitted to enter school up to 10.30 a.m., with a copy of the relevant medical papers of that day.
17. Entry to the office is from Gate No. 2 & 5.
18. Parents are requested to update their contact details on Scientific Study Portal and inform the Class Teacher via email, so that they may be contacted quickly in case of necessity/emergency.
19. In case of damage to school property, the entire cost of replacing will be levied on the student(s) responsible for the damage or the entire group/class in case of damage to class property.
20. It is important for you to interact frequently with your child's teachers on Visiting Days and on PTIs.
21. Please log on to www.ncsmumbai.com for all details regarding the school and on to www.cbse.nic.in for details regarding the Board.
22. It is imperative to note that in any kind of extracurricular or co-curricular activities/ competitions organised by outside agencies, participation by students is solely on discretion of parents.
23. The profit generated during sale of products as a part of Club Activity does not go to the school. These are sent to charitable organisations.

24. Events like Book sale during PTMs is done solely for the benefit of the community. No share of profit is shared with the school.
25. Parents should help their wards to practice socially acceptable behaviour.
26. Parents to ensure that children are not exposed to abusive language/behaviour or get impacted/ affected by it.
27. Parents are required to teach and help students practice basic eating etiquette.
28. Parents to be empathetic themselves towards parents and students with special needs.
29. Parents are suggested to maintain a healthy environment at home and focus on the overall holistic development of the students

Guidelines for Students

1. Students should have 75% attendance for promotion, and for leave over 3 days and above, parents are required to intimate the school.
2. Students should arrive at the School five minutes before the bell rings.
3. Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed.
4. The School uniform must be worn neatly on all working days.
5. Nails to be trimmed regularly.
6. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles to the School.
7. Students are not allowed to bring mobile phones/iPods/cameras/smart watch etc. in the School campus. These gadgets, if found in possession of the students within the School campus, will be confiscated and the same will be handed over/ returned at the end of the Academic year.
8. The name, class and section of the pupil should be clearly marked on all the belongings of the student.
9. Students should not take or damage things belonging to others.

Navy Children Schools aim at behavioural elegance and inculcation of discipline in the students.

Code of conduct for students. The following acts and conduct on the part of students will amount to misconduct:-

- (a) Misbehaviour towards teacher, students or any other employee of the school.
- (b) Internal disturbance of the classes.
- (c) Continued absence from classes without the permission of the teacher/ Head of the school.

- (d) Leaving the school premises or playground during school hours without prior permission of concerned teacher.
- (e) Involve in Ragging/ Bullying/ Cyber bullying/ intimidation of others/ body shaming/ Eve-teasing/ Adam-teasing-misbehaviour towards girl/ boy students or passing lewd comments.
- (f) Rowdy or rude behaviour.
- (g) Damaging/ disfiguring of school property.
- (h) Propagating a strike/ disruption of classes.
- (i) Association with banned organizations.
- (j) Disobeying lawful orders of the teacher/ Head of the School.
- (k) Bringing unauthorized people/ articles (including gadgets like mobile phone and smart watches) inside the school.
- (l) Theft/ pilferage of school/ employee/ student's property.
- (m) Indiscipline involving fighting/ theft/ any other act which may bring disrepute to the student/ school or to the Indian Navy in general.
- (n) Involving acts of moral turpitude.
- (o) Smoking/ Consumption of alcohol/ use of drugs, chewing betel leaves, pan masala, etc
- (p) Use of drugs or intoxicants except on prescription by a registered medical practitioner.
- (q) Use of violence in any form.
- (r) Propagate casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability.
- (s) Carrying any kind of weapon/ firecrackers in the school premises.
- (t) Improper use of computer resources of the school amounting to display or access of unauthorized websites, software portraying indecent / pornographic material.

- (u) Posting/ uploading/ commenting any kind of derogatory remarks about school/ school staff/ students on social media.
- (v) Inappropriate touch towards same or opposite sex.
- (w) Involving in any form of gambling.
- (x) Being in possession of or viewing/ reading/ screening/ sharing/ forwarding any kind of pornographic/ inappropriate material by SMS/ E-mail or any other medium. They are not to discuss or criticize the school or their teacher or any school staff/ authority on social/ public media.
- (y) Driving two/ four-wheeler to school without a valid driving license and helmet (in case of two wheelers).
- (z) Any other act or misconduct defined as an offence by the law of the land.

Student Discipline Committee

There shall be a **STUDENT DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE** comprising two teachers & a PTA member to investigate, recommend and advise the Principal regarding the penalty for breach of any of the code of conduct by a student. However, the final authority of awarding penalty shall be bestowed upon Principal of the school, who shall take suitable action depending on the gravity of offence, repetitive behaviour and recommendations of Student Discipline Committee.

SCHOOL RULES FOR STUDENTS

The following abridged but salient rules are for strict compliance:-

A. School Almanac and Identity Card

1. Identity Cards must be worn to school on all days. Loss of an Identity Card is a punishable offence.
2. The school almanac must be brought to the school every day.
3. All entries in the almanac from the school must be shown to parents and entries made by the parents to be brought to the notice of the relevant school staff.
4. Any child representing the school must be in proper uniform, be appropriately attired for the concerned activity and must be in possession of his/her Identity Card.

B. Attendance

1. Regular attendance in school is most essential. The minimum requirement of attendance in an academic year is 75%.
2. Leave of absence is given to students on prior application from the parents.
3. Request for leave should be intimated via the Scientific Study Portal.
4. Request for Long leave (more than 7 days), Medical leave, leave during mandatory days to be emailed to prin.ncs.mb@gmail.com
5. Students absent on account of illness are to submit valid medical certificates on return.
6. Students suffering from any communicable disease must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to school. They must also produce a Medical Fitness Certificate at that time.
7. During examinations, if a student has a medical condition which is non-infectious/ non-contagious/ non-communicable, cleared by doctor and can give the exam, they must report at the reception and separate arrangement will be made for such students. Parents to collect the students after examination.
8. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than seven consecutive days renders the students liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission will be granted only on payment of all dues and fresh admission fee.

C. Punctuality

All students must be present in school 10 minutes before the scheduled time. The school gate will close at 7.45 a.m. All late arrivals, without justified reasons, may be sent back home. After three late arrivals, parents will be contacted to take the child home.

D. Mandatory Working Days for the Students

1. Independence Day
2. Republic Day
3. Examination days
4. Certain mandatory activities and events will be conducted on Saturdays.

E. Discipline

1. The school aims at behavioural elegance and the inculcation of discipline, individually and in groups, while on school premises, functions as well as during organized trips.
2. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
3. Irregular attendance, neglect of homework, disobedience or disrespect towards staff or bad moral influence would lead to strict disciplinary action, in accordance with NES Guidelines.

4. Any damage to school property will be made good by the offending student(s) and would entail disciplinary action.

5. Classrooms would be locked when not in use. The class monitor will have a key of the classroom. The entire class would be responsible for any damage to class property.
6. Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences.
7. Students should greet their teachers when they meet them.
8. The school has a 'STUDENT DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE' consisting of teachers and members of the PTA who review disciplinary cases and recommend penalties on the lines prescribed by NES.
9. The school has constituted a committee which will look into reported cases of CHILDABUSE.

10. Students will be allowed entry to the school only in school uniform.

11. Warning Cards: A system of warning cards has been introduced in the school:

- a) Gross indiscipline by a student or subsequent act after written warning would entail the signing of a 'Pink Card' by the Principal. The father/parent of the defaulting student will be summoned to the Principal's office and this card will be handed over to him/her.
- b) A second act of gross indiscipline will result in the issue of a 'Grey Card' with a severe warning.
- c) A Grey card may be issued as a result of severe and gross indiscipline at the first instance itself.
- d) Any further act of gross indiscipline by the same student will result in expulsion of the child from NCS, on the authority of the Chairman, NCS (MB).

- F. Use of Unfair Means*.** All students are expected to maintain the highest standard of honesty in academic and in all other aspects of School life. Use of unfair means in tests or homework is considered as a serious offence. When a student is discovered to have used any dishonest means the following course of action will be initiated: -
- (a) Parents will be notified.
 - (b) The student will be awarded zero marks in the question/paper in which the unfair means were used.
 - (c) For a repeated offence, the student may be expelled from the school or will be liable for such other punishment as may be considered appropriate by the Principal.
 - (d) Where such unfair means/ practices have been found in public examinations like X & XII boards, the rules of punitive actions as promulgated by the respective boards shall apply.

Penalties. For the sake of fairness in disciplinary action to be taken by the teacher/ Head of the School for various disciplinary offences, guidelines are laid down in this paragraph. The guidelines indicate the maximum penalty that may be imposed. It does not indicate that punishments listed will automatically be administered. It must be emphasised that action taken by teachers/ Head of the School is intended to remedy problems as well as provide a safe and secure environment for learning. These guidelines are enumerated below: -

- (a) General classroom misconduct, misbehavior towards teachers/ any other employee of the school, disrupting the activities taking place, excessive noise, excessive talking, distracting action or comments: -
 - (i) 1st Offence. Teacher's discretion/refer to Head of the school.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Suspension from the Class for one day with intimation to parents.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Suspension from the Class for two days with intimation to parents.
- (b) Smoking or using drugs in School premises, Consumption of alcohol in School premises, possession of cigarettes/drugs or other similar items on person whilst in the School:- Parents to be informed. Appropriate action as deemed fit by the Head of the school under intimation to Chairperson SMC.
 - (i) 1st Offence. Suspension from the Class for One weeks & refer the matter to the parents under intimation to Chairperson SMC.

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- (ii) 2nd Offence. Suspension from the Class for Two week & refer the matter to the parents under intimation to Chairperson SMC.
- (iii) 3rd Offence. Initiation of expulsion procedure with intimation to parents.
- (c) Refusing the lawful directives of a teacher or Head of the school - as deemed appropriate by the Head of the school.
- (d) Theft/ pilferage of employee/ student's property. Stealing or possessing the property of an individual without express permission of the owner: -
 - (i) 1st Offence. Payment of double the cost of the loss and parents to be informed.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Payment of double the cost of the loss, parents to be informed & suspension from Class for two days.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Payment of loss and initiation of expulsion procedure with intimation to parents.
- (e) Stealing or possessing the School Property or willful destruction of school property: -
 - (i) 1st Offence. Payment of loss with intimation to parents.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Payment of loss and suspension from Class for three days with intimation to parents.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Payment of loss and initiation of expulsion procedure with intimation to parents.
- (f) Possessing or use of firecrackers and other incendiary items: -
 - (i) 1st Offence. Suspension from Class for three days. Parents to be informed.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Suspension from Class for six days Parents to be informed.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Initiation of expulsion procedure with intimation to parents.

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- (g) Possession of electronic gadgets like mobile phone, smart watches etc in school premises. – Confiscate and keep under safe custody at school till the end of the Academic Year (31st Mar) with intimation to parents.
- (h) Unacceptable language or name calling towards other students - To be handled by the individual teacher with appropriate reference to Parents/ Head of the school.
- (l) Propagate casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability - an appropriate punishment by the Head of the school.
- (j) Rowdy or rude behavior/ Verbal assault, obscene and vulgar language, gesture or threat towards any student or employee - An appropriate punishment by the Head of the school.
- (k) Propagating a strike, Association with banned organizations, use of violence in any form, Fighting, incitement that results in physical confrontation between students: -
- (i) 1st Offence. Parents to be informed.
- (ii) 2nd Offence. Suspension from Class for five days. Parents to be informed.
- (iii) 3rd Offence. Refer the matter to the Chairman. Parents to be informed.
- (l) Possession of weapons, use of any implement as a weapon, causing injury, harm or destruction to another person's property - The Parents to be informed. Appropriate action as deemed fit by the Head of the school under intimation to Chairperson SMC.
- (m) Leaving the school premises or playground during school hours without prior permission of concerned teacher.
- (i) 1st Offence. Parents to be informed.
- (ii) 2nd Offence. Suspension from the Class for one day with intimation to parents.
- (iii) 3rd Offence. Suspension from the Class for two days with intimation to parents.

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- (n) Bringing unauthorized people / articles inside the school - Appropriate action as deemed fit by the Head of the school
- (o) Absenting from class: -
 - (i) 1st Offence. Refer the matter to the parents.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Refer the matter to the parents, record on students Almanac and extra home work.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Refer the matter to the Principal for disciplinary action.
- (p) Late coming to School. Late coming to school twice within 30 days period will result in the assignment of one detention unless the student brings a note from parent or guardian explaining the reasons for coming late.
- (q) Habitual Latecomer. Appropriate action as deemed necessary by the Head of the school.
- (r) Driving two/ four-wheeler to school without a valid driving license and helmet in case of two wheelers)
 - (i) 1st Offence. Refer the matter to the parents. Vehicle is to be confiscated and handed over to parent/ owner only.
 - (ii) 2nd Offence. Refer the matter to the parents, warning letter to be issued by Principal and a copy of the same to be forwarded to the Chairperson SMC and the parent's Unit. Vehicle is to be confiscated and handed over to parent/ owner only.
 - (iii) 3rd Offence. Initiation of expulsion procedure with intimation to parents. Vehicle is to be confiscated and handed over to parent/ owner only.
- (s) Involving in acts of moral turpitude/ involve in ragging/ bullying/ cyber bullying/ intimidation of others/ body shaming. Eve-teasing/ Adam-teasing- misbehavior towards girl / boy students or passing lewd comments, Displaying pornographic material, Inappropriate touch towards same or opposite sex, improper use of computer resources of the school amounting to display or access of unauthorized websites / software portraying indecent/ pornographic material, Posting/ uploading derogatory remarks about school/ school staff/ students on social media, any form of gambling: -

- (i) 1st Offence. Parent will be immediately notified. Student will be placed under suspension, pending investigation under intimation to Chairperson, SMC. All actions as per Article 0708 are to be followed. Student and parent to be counselled by the Head of the school before reinstating to school.
- (ii) 2nd Offence. Initiate action for expulsion from school.

Delegation of Power of Punishment. Power of punishment may be delegated to teachers for some of first offences as decided by SMC. All cases of expulsion are to be forwarded to the Chairperson SMC for approval before a student is expelled from the school.

Investigation Procedure for Serious Offences. When circumstances warrant the expulsion or rustication of a student, the following procedure be followed:-

- (a) The Head of the school will inform Chairperson of SMC of the charges.
- (b) Written notice of charges against the student shall be given to the student and his/her parents.
- (c) A formal hearing will be scheduled within 7 days of such notice in the presence of a Board consisting of the Chairperson's representative, Head of the school and PTA representative.
- (d) The parents shall be present at the hearing. Witnesses may be cross-examined by the parents.
- (e) A written record of the hearing shall be kept.
- (f) The Board shall ascertain the facts and confirm the punishment of expulsion or any other lesser punishment as deemed adequate.
- (g) The findings and recommendations of the Board shall be sent to the Chairperson SMC for his approval.
- (h) The Chairperson's decision shall be communicated to the parents.

For a repeated offence the student may be expelled from the school or will be liable for such other punishments as may be considered appropriate by the 'Head of School'. Whilst three consecutive offences for which penalties have been awarded will render him/her liable to expulsion from the school. The Principal also reserves the right to recommend the withdrawal of a student on disciplinary grounds without warning, if circumstances deemed so.

The expulsion shall debar a student from being re-admitted to any Navy Children School under NES. No student shall be expelled from the School without giving the parents or guardian of the student a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the proposed action. Expulsion shall be resorted to only in cases of grave offences where the retention of the student in the School is likely to endanger its moral tone of discipline.

Disciplinary Action/ Punishment (Above 8 years & below 14 years old).

The punishments enumerated above do not apply to the Preparatory or Middle-class children below the age of 14 years. Every effort is to be made to discipline the Primary School children using variations of tone. In no case any corporal punishment, be awarded to these children. In some cases of repetitive misdemeanors, age appropriate corrective action may be undertaken for Preparatory and Middle-school children.

Foundational Stage (below 8 years old). Students below the age of 8 years are too young to understand the consequence of their behavior. Hence setting 'code of conduct' for them and/or taking disciplinary measures etc are not recommended. Instead, parents need to be given guidelines in the school almanac as to provide basic training to their children to make them 'school ready'.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Students should make it a matter of personal pride to utilise library books with utmost care.
2. The students are not to take any book from the library without proper entry in the issue register.
3. Only one book will be issued at a time for the duration of one week. It may be re-issued for another week. For such a renewal, the book must be produced.
4. The attention of the librarian should be drawn to damage to books.
5. All the books must be returned before the end of each term. A borrower who fails to return a book will have to pay a fine of ₹1/- per day.
6. Students of Std. X & XII will be required to return all library books and obtain clearance certificate from the Librarian before applying for the CBSE Examination hall ticket.
7. Library cards are not transferable.
8. Students are responsible for the safe upkeep of the books. Any damage caused to the books inside or outside the library will entail a levy of charges.
9. Students should not carry Note Books to the Library during their Library period.
10. They should not scribble / draw / write on / or deface the Library books in any manner.
11. Library Timings:
Monday to Friday: 8.00 a.m. to 4 p.m.
1st, 3rd & 5th Saturdays and during Vacations: 9.00 a.m. - 1.00 p.m.
12. Students should be encouraged to utilise the Library facilities to the maximum.

BUS RULES

1. Regular transport arrangements are **made by the NT Pool, Mumbai**, for naval children up to Std. XII. Bus Passes and registrations for travel are to be made at NT Pool.
2. All enquiries regarding the Naval School buses to be addressed to the OIC, NT Pool.
3. Students can avail the school transport. Students using the Yellow School bus are responsible for the maintenance of discipline. The following rules must be observed in the interest of safety:
 - (a) Students using the school bus are to be at the specified bus stop at least 10 minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
 - (b) No student may change his/her bus route without written permission from the Bus-in-charge.
 - (c) No waste/object of any kind is to be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.
 - (d) Students will be held responsible for any damage to the bus if caused by negligence or vandalism.
 - (e) Unruly behaviour is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.
 - (f) No student is permitted to board any bus other than the one he/she is entitled to.
 - (g) Each student using the school bus will be required to fill in an indemnity form before availing the school transport.
 - (h) Bus fees are payable for all 12 months of the year.

Utmost importance is given to the proper turnout of students, cleanliness, correct uniform material and adherence to prescribed pattern of tailoring. All fabric must be of Teri-cot.

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- Students should not visit public places in school uniform. They are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both in school and outside. Misbehaviour in public places will be dealt with severely.
- Any child representing the school must be in proper uniform, be appropriately attired for the concerned activity and must be in possession of his/her Identity Card.
- Turn out and Uniform Code:
 1. Neat, freshly washed and ironed uniforms are to be worn by all students.
 2. The students must present a neat and tidy appearance with well-groomed hair. The hair should not touch the shirt collar at the nape of the neck in the case of boys.
 3. Girls are not allowed to keep long hair loose. 'Flicks' and 'fringes' are not permitted. Hair longer than shoulder must be plaited.
 4. Colouring / streaking of hair, tattoos, ear and/or body piercing will not be allowed.
